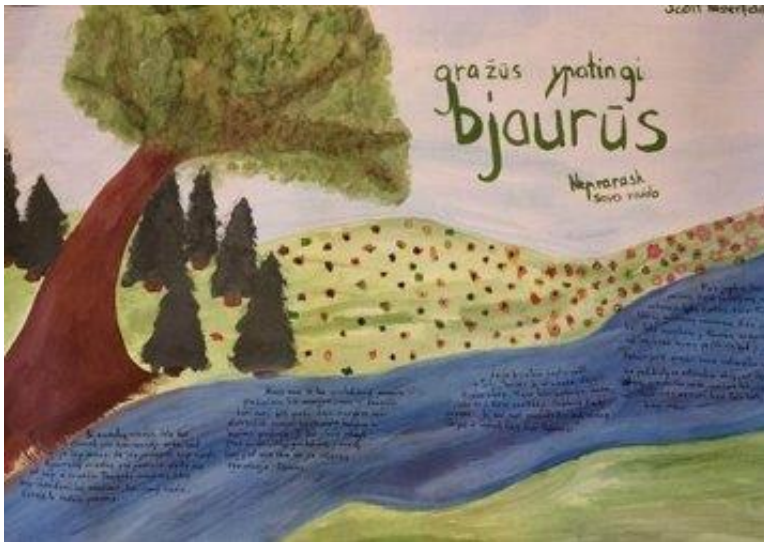

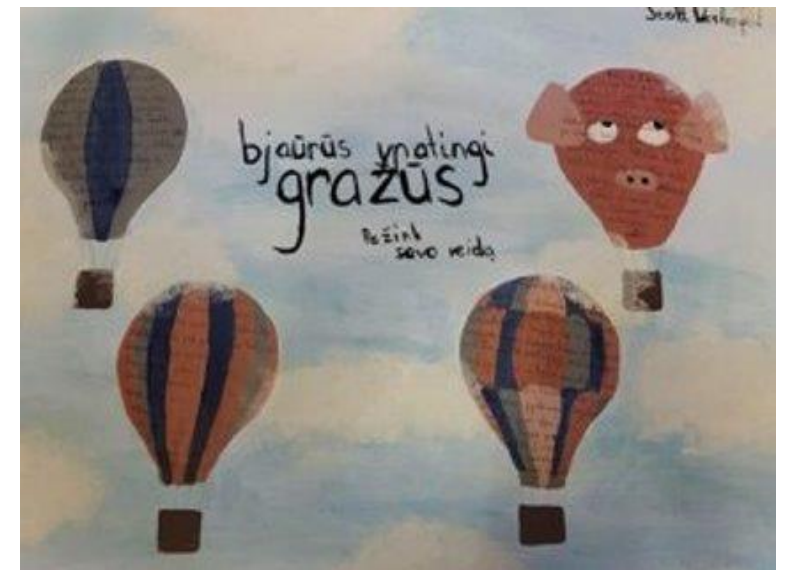
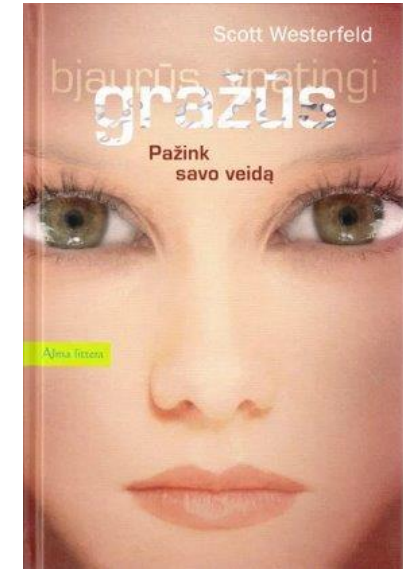
„Uglies“

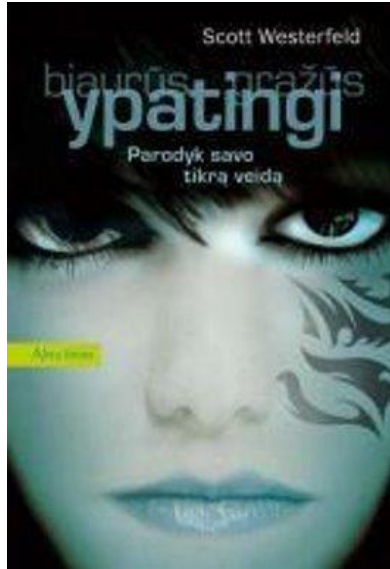
- In this drawing you can see a river, a forest and a field of flowers.
