UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITES

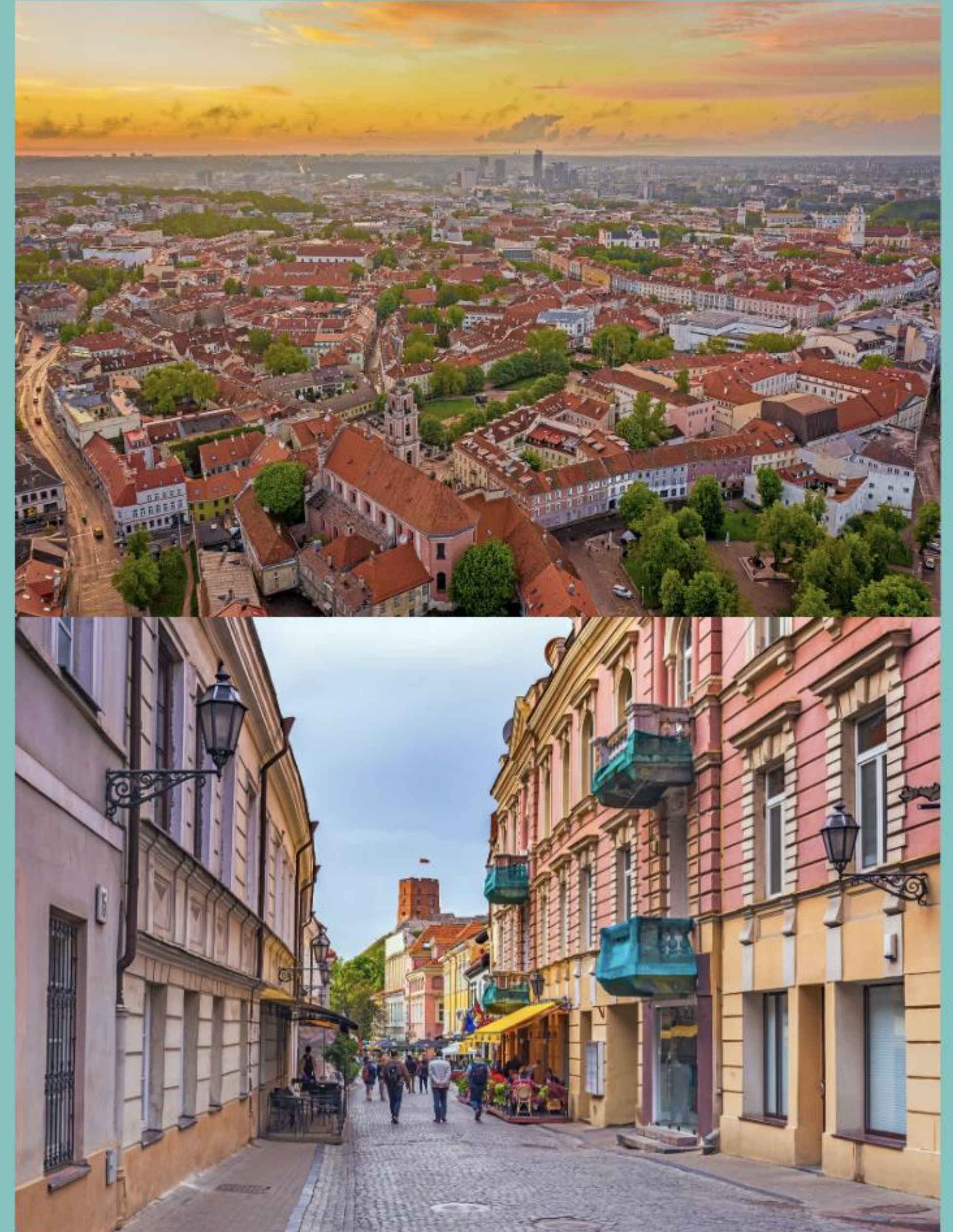


HILL OF CROSSES

Some of the traditional Lithuanian desserts include šakotis, žagareliai, and apple pie. In addition, many desserts have arrived to Lithuania during the 20th century from the West.

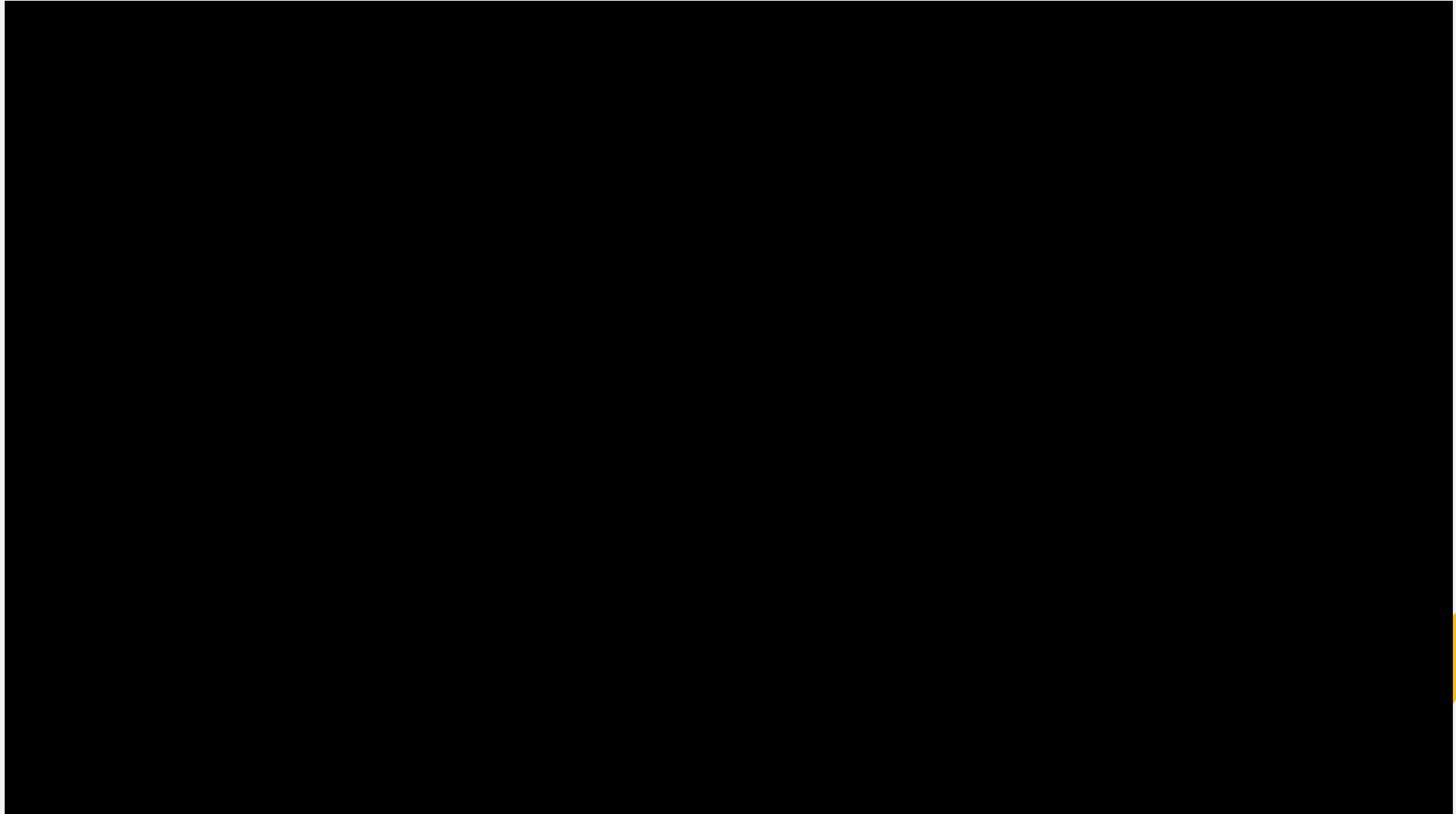


DRINKS
